About MATILDE

MATILDE is a 3-year project funded by EU Horizon 2020, focusing on the impact of migration on the local development of rural and mountain regions. The project develops and tests a transdisciplinary conceptual and methodological framework for a multidimensional assessment of the economic and social impacts of Third Country Nationals (TNCs).

MATILDE aims to examine how migration impacts local development and territorial cohesion in European rural and mountain regions, as well as to improve integration and local development.

MATILDE will conduct 13 case studies throughout Europe. Case studies are selected based on the presence of urban poles, differently interconnected with rural and mountain areas via flows of people, economic resources and cultural exchange.

Deadlines

Opening date for the submission: 9 May 2021

Closing date for the submission: 9 August 2021 at 23.59 CET

Publication of the results

The three winners will be announced 1 month after the end of the contest, on the 9 September 2021 from the Twitter, Instagram, Facebook and LinkedIn accounts of the MATILDE project.

How will the winners be selected?

A jury consisting of communication and dissemination board members of the MATILDE and professional photographers will select the three winning photos. The photographs that are the most visually original and most relevant to the framework of the contest, will win.

If the winner does not contact the MATILDE providing the required information to receive the prize within a period of fifteen days of having received notification, the winner forfeits the prize and a substitute winner shall be determined.

What are the prizes?

Three winners will be offered a unique and exclusive workshop with Opher Thomson, a professional landscape photographer and director of the film *The New Wild: Life in the Abandoned Lands*. Opher has worked extensively in rural and mountainous regions across Europe, and the workshop will focus on techniques for better exploring, understanding and narrating places through photography.

Eligibility Criteria

- Participation in the contest is free and open to all persons above 18 years old.

Technical requirements for submitted photos

- Each photograph submitted must be 5 megabytes or smaller; must be in JPEG or .jpg format and must be 1920x1080 pixels.

- There must be no border(s), logo(s), copyright marks, identifying marks, or any other visible references and/or marks on the image.

- The photograph need not be taken with a digital camera; scans of negatives, transparencies, or photographic prints are acceptable.

- Basic cropping and color correction are acceptable but special effects, computer-generated images and other heavy modifications should be avoided.

Specifications for submitted photos

- The Participant must own full copyrights to the submitted material. By submitting the entry, you will be presumed to have agreed to accept the Terms and Conditions and Privacy Policy.

- The photo must not depict violence, profanity, sex or direct attacks on individuals or organizations. Any entries deemed offensive will be immediately disqualified.

- The Participant must certify and warrant that the submitted photo(s) does not violate the rights of a third party or any copyright. MATILDE is not responsible for intellectual property violations that might have resulted through the submissions of photos.

- The Participant confirms that any person possibly appearing in the photos have given their permission for the use of their images. In case of children, the parents of the children must give the permission to the photographer.

The Participant should make sure to obtain from those who are in the picture(s) to submit the written consent for publishing these pictures on the website and the social media accounts of the MATILDE Project.

The Participant should keep the consent forms in a safe place for the period of the contest up to 6 months.
